

Local Need

ALICE: Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed – households that earn above the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) but cannot afford the basic cost of living in their county. Despite struggling to make ends meet, ALICE households often do not qualify for public assistance.

- 42% of St. Clair County (SCC) households meet the ALICE threshold, and 14% are below the FPL.
- 49% of SCC senior citizens meet the ALICE threshold.
- In 2021, more than 450 SCC students were homeless.
- More than 25% of the adults in SCC had trouble meeting healthcare needs.

Donor Impact

Last year, donations impacted our neighbors by helping:

- 112 youth receive homeless, including shelter and street outreach supplies.
- 273 adults receive life-saving prescription assistance.
- 224 disabled youth & adults receive advocacy support to connect with available resources & resolve concerns.
- 430 men, women & children receive emergency shelter.
- 350 residents utilize substance use recovery resources.
