United Way embodies the spirit of living united within the community. Last year, United Way **211 answered more than 3,109 calls**, connecting residents of St. Clair County to essential community resources. Through **23 Affiliated Organizations**, the United Way funded **43 programs** that directly impacted more than **8,000 residents**. These are often hardworking members of the community, facing difficult times. The need within the community is significant, but with continued support, there is hope for a brighter future!

Due, in part, to your generous contributions to the United Way of St. Clair County last year:

- More than 60,000 meals were served at **Mid-City Nutrition Soup Kitchen**.
- **Blue Water Safe Horizons Carolyn's Place Shelter** provided safety and support to 335 survivors of domestic violence on their journey toward healing.
- Through **Visiting Nurse Association** 112 seniors and individuals with a disability received a **PERS Alert**, a personal emergency response system, for fall-risks or medical emergencies allowing them to preserve independence and feel safer at home and in the community.
- 86 young people found stability and support for their education at **The Harbor**, a shelter for runaway and homeless youth.
- The United Way funded mental health counseling for 130 uninsured or underinsured individuals through **Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan**.
- 4,264 children ages 0–5 enrolled in the **Imagination Library** program received a free age-appropriate book delivered to their mailbox each month. 594,193 books have been delivered by this program since its inception, with 11,822 St. Clair County children having “graduated” (turned 5 years old) after receiving a new book every single month during their formative developmental years.
- **Michigan Rehabilitation Services** assisted 200 individuals with training and job placement opportunities.
- The **United Way Medical Loan Closet** had 698 visits for durable and disposable medical supplies.
- The **United Way** funded home **wheelchair ramps** for six households in need, which will allow for safety, independence, and inclusion for their family member with a disability.
- Through a partnership with **St. Clair County RESA**, the **United Way Childcare Assistance Program** was created for low-income employed families who are seeking childcare for children 3 years and below so that all children get the opportunity for high-quality childcare at a subsidized rate in St. Clair County.
